Our NEW Lead-Safe Homes Program helps coordinate and pay for the safe removal of lead hazards from homes and rental properties in Winnebago County.

Lead can damage the brain, body and nervous system. "Even at low levels, it affects learning capacity, the ability to pay attention and academic achievement," says Scott Fischer, Lead Abatement Project Coordinator for the Winnebago County Health Department.

Common sources include lead-based paint, lead dust and contaminated soil. Kids under age 6 are more likely to get lead poisoning by putting things in their mouths that are contaminated with lead dust, eating paint chips and chewing on windowsills or door frames. Removing lead hazards ensures

that kids do not experience long-term effects of lead exposure.

LEAD-SAFE HOMES PROGRAM

The Lead-Safe Homes Program helps coordinate and pay for the safe removal of lead hazards from homes and rental properties in Winnebago County.

Why is lead bad? Exposure to lead damages the brain, body and nervous system. Even at low levels, it affects learning capacity, ability to pay attention and academic achievement. Lead is toxic to everyone, but children under age 6 are at greatest risk for harm. Lead is most commonly found in lead-based paint, lead dust and contaminated soil in homes built before 1978. Exposure in kids typically happens when they put things in their mouths that are contaminated with lead dust, eat paint chips or chew on windowsills and door frames.

Lead poisoning is preventable. The Winnebago County Health Department's Lead-Safe Homes Program makes homes safe for kids and pregnant women by safely removing lead hazards to ensure that kids do not experience long-term effects of lead exposure.

Maraschino Cherry Almond Cookies

(Serves 88)

- 4 cups butter, softened
- 4 teaspoons almond extract
- 4 cups powdered sugar
- 9 cups all-purpose flour, optional
- 8 tablespoons maraschino cherry juice
- 2 cups maraschino cherries, chopped
- 4 cups semisweet chocolate chips

Cover cookie sheet with parchment paper.

In large bowl with mixer, beat until smooth and creamy. Beat in almond extract and powdered sugar. Turn mixer to stir or low and slowly add flour mixing until incorporated. Mix in cherry juice and cherries. Stir in chocolate chips.

Roll into 1 inch balls and place on parchment paper. Spray bottom of glass with non stick cooking spray and flatten balls. You will need to spray the glass several times.

Bake for 12-14 minutes. Allow to cool.


